**Parent Participation Information**

It is expected that, during the course of the year, each child's parent/s will periodically provide snack for the school. Assignments will be made on a rotating basis; most families will have this obligation three times during the year. Once the schedule is made, families may trade dates, or otherwise arrange for snack to be dropped off. The snack should be kosher style, and include drinks. In the event that the snack duty is "forgotten" – a \$10 fee will be assessed to reimburse the Religious School for depleting supplies.

Throughout the year, parents will be asked to join the Religious school for various events celebrating holidays and promoting Jewish Education – as each event approaches we will ask for your participation and assistance in these activities.

**Important dates:**

- A Family Education Program and Orientation will be held Sunday, August 30th 2009 from 10 AM – Noon. All family members are invited, an RSVP will be expected
- Religious School will begin at 9 AM on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup> 2009
- Last day of Religious School is Sunday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2010
- All classes, unless otherwise indicated begin at 9:00 am and end at Noon.

**Fees**

\$ 25.00	Nonrefundable registration fee per student, due with the Registration Form.
\$290.00	Tuition fee for first and second student in a family (members only).
\$145.00	Tuition fee for third or more student/s in a family (members only)
\$450.00	Tuition fee for non-member child entering Grades 1-3 only. Children of non-members who are entering grades 4 and up may not be enrolled.

A minimum of 50% of tuition is due by August 30th, 2009, with the remainder due before February 1st, 2010.

A Statement about Jewish Education

Jewish learning is an ongoing process of study and practice that occurs in many places and times throughout one's lifetime. Good and consistent modeling of Jewish values by teachers, parents and congregational leaders is essential to the process of helping children translate Jewish learning into Jewish living.

Because we, the members of Congregation Bet Chaim believe:

- That the education of our Jewish children in the faith, beliefs, practices, traditions, and history of our Jewish People is of the highest priority;
- That the Jewish education of our children is an investment in our Jewish future;
- That Jewish literacy leads to dynamic, curious, caring, committed Jews, with a positive Jewish self-identity, who celebrate their Judaism with pride;
- That the value children give their Jewish religious education is based on the value their parents place on that education;
- That an essential ingredient of Jewish learning is the modeling, by teachers and parents alike, of Jewish values, practices, study, celebrations, and worship;
- That parents and families should share with teachers in the provision of Jewish experiences and in the making of Jewish memories;
- That Jewish literacy leads to tolerance of diversity in thought and action, and also enables us to have the strength to struggle against and stand up to those who would try to convert or condemn us;
- And finally, that Jewish learning is successful when it leads to Jewish living,

It is our goal that each student, encouraged, through study, dialogue, investigation, and the arts, will be enabled to:

- Continue to ask questions and search for answers,
- And make the informed choices
- That will make the living and practice of Judaism personally and spiritually meaningful.
